
House Bill 60 will hurt public schools like ours. Let's tell our elected House Representatives to VOTE NO

Why *We* Would Vote NO

House Bill 60 allows for students to get scholarship money to transfer to private schools if their public school didn't have 100% in-person education due to COVID.

If that student leaves a public school, the money allocated for them leaves too. But the school still has to stay open and pay the same bills! Public schools in GA could lose \$448 million!

This bill will hurt urban public schools most - those unable to open due to high density communities and those most impacted by COVID.

School choice is not usually a choice for those in poverty / carless in GA. (The scholarship is not usually enough to cover tuition).
